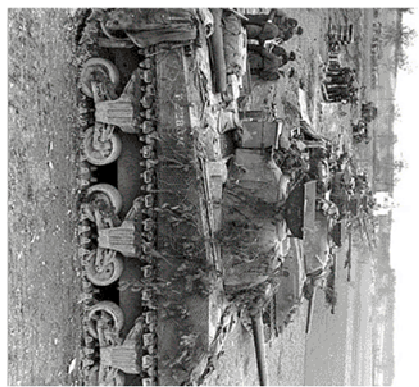

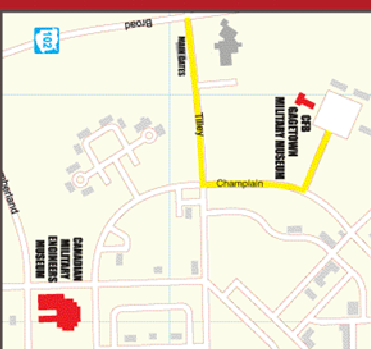
The History

The CFB Gagetown Military Museum was granted official Canadian Forces Museum status in 1973. Since that time it has grown and evolved into one of the largest museums of its kind.

Our role is to collect, preserve and promote Canada's Military Heritage.

Our mission is to collect, preserve, research and exhibit artifacts which illustrate the history and heritage of the military forces in New Brunswick from 1800 to the present day, and the Canadian Army at war during peace time and on United Nations/Multi duty.



Visit Us

The Military Museum, located in building A-5 on the Base, contains weapons, uniforms, equipment and memorabilia as well as an outdoor collection of vehicles and artillery.

The CFB Gagetown Military Museum is open year round, June - August 31, Monday to Friday 8 am - 4 pm, Saturday and Sunday 10 am - 4 pm, September - May 31, Monday to Friday 8 am - 4 pm, closed on weekends.

Admission is free, there is ample parking including accommodation for buses and R.V.s. Access to the base and the museum is unrestricted, just follow the signs.
