Council Highlights

2024 AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Council approved the 2024 Town of Oromocto Audited Financial Statements that were prepared by Teed Saunders and Doyle.

2024 ANNUAL REPORT

Council approved the 2024 Town of Oromocto Annual Report which highlights a number of activities and contains the 2024 Audited Financial Statements. A copy is available on the Town's website at www.oromocto.ca.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING

Starting 1 May 2025 curbside recycling began within the Town by Fero. If you have any questions about the program, please address them to Fero at 1-800-668-3376 or you learn more at www.circularmaterials.ca/Oromocto. Council authorized the Town to remove the recycling bins at all locations, except for the ones behind Station 1 Fire Hall. That bin will remain on a temporary basis only.

LAND SALES

Council approved two separate land sales: 137 MacDonald Avenue, the former Town Hall, to Thomas Bettle (\$200,000) and 12.88 acres of un-serviced land in the Pine Ridge Subdivision to Maschmeyer Estates and Dale Enterprises (\$125,000).

50 HUBBARD AVENUE DEMOLITION

Leading Edge Excavation was awarded the tender to demolish the former Hubbard School in the amount of \$725,000. This site is proposed to be the new location for the new public recreation and wellness facility.

ENGINEERING AND PUBLIC WORKS PURCHASES

The Engineering and Public Works Department were authorized to purchase of a Turf Field Vacuum (\$42,977) and Lighting at the Hazen Park Ballfield (\$43,000).

ANNUAL INDIGENOUS SERVICES AGREEMENT

Council approved the 2025/2026 Annual Indigenous Services Agreement with Indigenous Services Canada to deliver services to the Oromocto First Nation.

CLIMATE ACTION/ZERO CARBON COMMITTEE

The Committee initiated a poster contest for school-aged children to demonstrate what Oromocto means to them in relation to land use. With the assistance of Canadian Tire, prizes will be awarded. The submissions can be viewed on the Town's Facebook page and on its website at www.oromocto.ca.

Digging into an underground utility can be dangerous, create service disruptions, and have costly consequences. Whether you're planning a home improvement project, installing a fence or deck, or even planting a tree, ensure to call or email before you dig to safely identify any buried utility lines:

Yard Waste:

Residents of Oromocto can drop off Organic yard waste year-round 24/7 to the Department of Engineering & Public Works facilities located at 181 Black Watch Ave. Organic yard waste include items such as grass clippings, branches, trees/bushes, garden refuse and other similar articles. Only compostable bags are permitted. NO COMMERCIAL DUMPING, CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL, NOR HOUSEHOLD WASTE PERMITTED. *The Fredericton Region Solid Waste Commission can be reached for these services by calling 506-453-9938 (located at 1775 Alison Blvd.). Annual Hydrant Flushing:

The Town of Oromocto's annual Water Main Flushing Program typically takes place over the summer months in July and/or August.

Marina:

The Town of Oromocto operates the Marina Gas Docks located at 4 Wharf Road. Fueling and pump-out services are offered to pleasure craft operators at the docks. Cash and debit/credit card payments are accepted. Summer hours run from 11:30 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. (7 days a week). Anticipated opening date is in early July. Date TBC on Town Social Media.


