

April - June 2019

Welamukotuk 2019 NB Indian Summer Games

The Town is pleased to support the Oromocto First Nation as it hosts the Welamukotuk 2019 Indian Summer Games. It is expected that over 1,000 athletes and coaches will be in Town participating in this event designed for aboriginal youth between the ages of 5 to 19 years of age from August 6 - 9. Watch for a detailed schedule on the Town's website and social media over the coming weeks.

Recreation and Tourism Annual Recognition Awards

The annual recognition awards dinner was held on 21 May at the Oromocto Legion. The following teams were recognized as Provincial Awards Winners: Peewee A Pioneers (baseball), Oromocto U18 (basketball), Team Evans (curling), Team Lewis (curling), Peewee C Blackjacks (hockey), Peewee AA Eagles (hockey) and U14 Rebels (ringette). The Carrie Howe Volunteer Award was presented to Curtis Gallagher. Congratulations to all the award winners on your achievement.

Age-Friendly Community (AFC) Survey

The Oromocto AFC Advisory Committee concluded its survey of its older adults on recommendations for consideration by Town Council to help create a safer, healthier & improved quality of life. The results will be reviewed by the Committee & brought forward to Council.

IG Wealth Management Walk for Alzheimer's

The first ever Walk for Alzheimer's in Oromocto raised an astounding \$9,004.30 to support the work of the Alzheimer Society. With over 700 attendees, this walk had the largest number of participants ever seen by the NB Alzheimer Society in 15 years of hosting this event.

Land Development

Council authorized the Mayor and Chief Administrative Officer to enter into an agreement for the sale of land located off Brayson Boulevard for the purpose of a new professional services/commercial development.

Audited Financial Statements

Council accepted the Town of Oromocto's audited financial statement for the fiscal year ending 31 Dec 2018, prepared & presented by Grant Thornton Chartered Accountants. The Town realized a \$36k surplus in its General Operating Fund and a \$14K surplus in its Water & Sewer Operating Fund.

Tender Awards

Council approved the tenders for a Half Ton truck, a Tahoe SUV, a dump body, the provision of engineering design services for the water system upgrade to MacDonald Avenue, as well the annual asphalt re-surfacing and concrete curbs for selected Town streets, including MacDonald Ave, Cowichan Street, Carpenter Drive, Hersey Street and Finnamore extension.

New Section of Boardwalk Now Open

On June 1, the Town celebrated Parks & Trails Day at the Oromocto Gateway Nature Trails. It was a perfect time for families to come together and explore the trails and the newly constructed boardwalk section.
