Adult supervision is recommended.



ATTENTION PET OWNERS

As per Town By-law 417 dogs & cats "running at large" or an animal unleashed or unharnessed on any property other than the owner's, excepting those participating in a sanctioned show or event or at a designated off-leash park, is prohibited within Town limits.

As per Town By-law 417, if an animal defecates on any public or private property, other than the property of its owner, the owner shall remove such feces.

GATEWAY TRAIL Parking Area Closed Alternate Trail Access

Please be advised that the Gateway Wetland trail head parking lot and picnic area off Gateway Drive will be closed as construction for the new visitor and interpretive centre will begin.

Most of the trail is still accessible, and parking is available at Canadian Tire Oromocto on Miramichi Road.

A Wetland trail access point is directly across from Canadian Tire and there is a crosswalk leading to it. Please use caution when crossing this busy street.

Another parking and access option is at the end of D'Amours St.

the Gateway Wetlands Nature Trails is

well underway. It is expected the work

will be completed in the Fall 2021 and

officially opened in the Spring 2022.

The construction of the new Visitor Information and Interpretive Centre at

Oromocto's parks and trails allow all individuals a chance to enjoy the outdoors and to improve their physical & emotional well being.

- ❖ The Town boasts 25 local areas of parkland and maintains 6 Neighbourhood parks, 8 district parks, 3 nature reserves and 1 off-leash dog park.
- ❖ The average square meters per person of parkland, within incorporated areas in North America, ranges from 15m² to 30m². The Town of Oromocto citizens enjoy 195m² per person!

Here are just a few examples of the parks and trails ready for you to discover and explore:

Deer Park Nature Trails

This 87-hectare wooded area is located along the Town's waterfront. It offers beautiful views of the Oromocto River and is a popular destination among locals and visitors with its groomed trails for walking, hiking and biking. It is one of the three nature reserves within the Town.



Playgrounds and Splash Pads

are safe, fun, and popular spots for kids and families to gather. Oromocto's three splash pads delight kids with water gun stations, fountains and spouts, bucket-dumping stations and they also have washrooms and covered picnic shelters onsite. The pads

typically open the first week of June.



The Hazen Park is a beautifully manicured public area with a multitude of historic monuments. It is a popular location for weddings & special occasion photography as well as a great destination to have a picnic, view the boats at the marina, listen to entertainment, go for a paddle or even launch your boat at the public boat launch.

WHAT YOU CAN DO!

Stoop and Scoop

Oromocto has an off-leash dog park located on Saint John Avenue. Dog owners are reminded to respect the rules of the park by keeping their dogs leashed unless they are within the designated off-leash area. All owners are required to pick up after their dogs anywhere within the Town.

Hazards of Feeding Wildlife in an Urban Area

The Town of Oromocto does not encourage the feeding of wildlife. This practice almost always carries with it negative consequences for the wildlife involved. There are also a number of safety and social concerns for the public, such as the potential increase in vehicle collisions, as well as damage to property and nuisance problems.

Wildlife should derive their food and shelter from natural habitats and under natural conditions. This will help maintain natural adaptations that ensure the long-term survival of the animals themselves, and of the species.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS MAY - JUNE 2021

Municipal Elections & Swearing-In Ceremony

The municipal council swearing in ceremony was held on 27 May 2021 at the Hazen Park Centre. The representatives that were acclaimed to their positions include: Mayor Robert Powell, Deputy Mayor Lorraine Dawe, Councillor Jeff Kirkbride, Councillor Sheridan Mawhinney, Councillor Kelly Murdock, Councillor Raymond Henry and Councillor Mariliz Parent.

Onondaga Street Watermain Upgrade

Fairville Construction Ltd. was awarded the tender for the watermain upgrades on Onondaga Street in the amount of \$831,988.20.

Asphalt Resurfacing and Concrete Curbing

Northern Construction was awarded the annual asphalt resurfacing and concrete curbing tender in the amount of \$1,015,363.75.

Visitor Information Centre

Construction on the new visitor information centre continues. Council approved an additional \$226,000 for the increased engineering site costs and related contingency.

Black Watch Avenue Land Sale

A 3.88 acre parcel of land located between Black Watch Avenue and Doyle Drive was sold to KSM Ventures for the purpose of constructing multiple multi-unit buildings.

Land Lease Renewal – Gateway Drive TDL Group

The Mayor was authorized to enter into a lease agreement extension with TDL Group Corporation for an additional ten year land lease at Gateway Drive.


