TOWN OF OROMOCTO Curbside Spring Cleanup Program 8 to 19 May inclusive

ELIGIBLE ITEMS:

- Pieces of tree, brush, lawn rakings, garden refuse and similar articles, but **NOT appliances, furniture or tires**. Please compost where feasible.
- Lawn rakings and other similar rubbish must be bagged in clear plastic bags and placed at curbside for pick-up.
- Individual bundles or items **SHALL NOT** exceed one meter (1 yard) in greatest dimension nor weigh more than 20 kilograms (44 pounds).

FORBIDDEN ITEMS:

Petroleum, chemical or solvent/paint type products or any hazardous waste is **FORBIDDEN**.

Recyclable items must be recycled.

PICK UP:

Materials **MUST** be placed at curbside no earlier than Monday, 8 May, no later than 7:00 a.m. on 19 May.

DROP OFF:

Eligible items can also be taken to the Fredericton Region Solid Waste Commission (1775 Alison Blvd.)

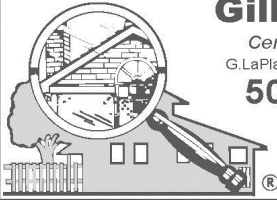
ATTENTION PET OWNERS
