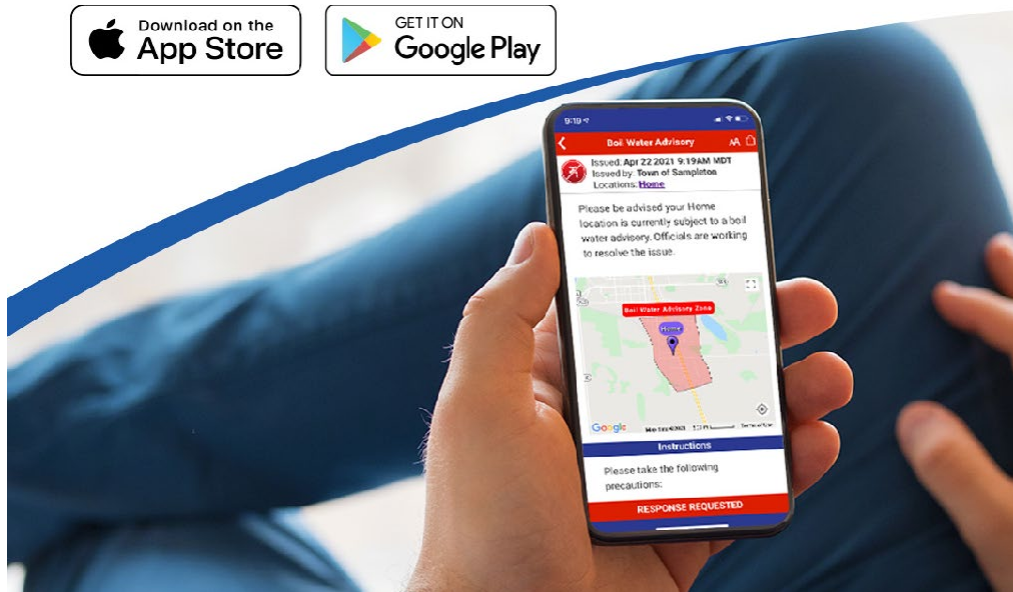

Voyent Alert! is a multi-purpose service provided by the Town of Oromocto to keep you informed of critical events like fires or floods as well as day-to-day communications such as road maintenance and closures, sports facility closures, water advisories, etc.

Voyent Alert! allows you to create and follow multiple locations such as "Kids School" or "Mom's House". Any event or communication related to your followed locations will be forwarded to you along your preferred communication channel.

Smart alerting capabilities ensure that you will only get notified when a communication is relevant to you or one of the locations you are following.

DO'S

- Place only organic yard waste materials out for pickup
- Use compostable bags
- Keep yard waste pickup separate from garbage pickup
- Bundle bush and branches no larger than 5' long x 2" diameter

DON'TS

- Leave lumber or other construction materials
- Don't use plastic bags
- Leave out household items or hazardous materials
- Leave loose leaves, logs or stumps

Council Highlights

2028-30 PROVINCIAL-MUNICIPAL HIGHWAY PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

Council approved the 2028-2030 Provincial-Municipal Highway Partnership Program plan to the Province of New Brunswick to include:

2028: Route 102 – Lincoln Road, Restigouche Road at Waasis Road extending to 100.0m past the Lincoln Bridge on the north-westerly side;

2029: Route 102 – Waasis Road, Waasis Road at Broad Road to Waasis Road near MacDonald Avenue intersection; and

2030: Route 102-Broad Road, southerly Town limits extending 275.0m north of Broad Road at MacKenzie Avenue.

CANADA HOUSING INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM CONTRIBUTION AGREEMENT

The Mayor and Chief Administrative Officer/Town Clerk was authorized to enter into an agreement with the Canadian Housing Infrastructure Fund Contribution related to the Cyr Street extension project.

SCOLLAR STREET - PHASE 1 PROJECT

RESOLVED: THAT the tender for the Scollar Street Phase I project be awarded to Dexter Construction in the amount of \$1,433,000.00 (one million, four hundred and thirty-three thousand dollars) plus HST.

5-YEAR FINANCIAL PLAN

Council approved a 5-Year Financial Plan to enable it to construct and operate the Oromocto Regional Wellness and Recreation Centre, replace 2 major fire trucks and construct a new fire station to meet the growing demands of the community, as well as maintain and increase the Town's water and sewer infrastructure through the construction of a lagoon and upgrade of existing infrastructure.

EMPLOYMENT MATTERS

Council authorized the creation of a new position within the Corporate Services Division whose primary focus will be related to generating revenue for capital projects.

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING PROGRAM

The Town's annual Christmas Tree Recycling Program typically begins on Christmas Day and runs for approximately one (1) week into the New Year.

Christmas Tree Drop-Off Locations are available for residents in Wards 1–4 at the following sites:

- Parking lot at the Kings Arrow Arena (immediately to the right from Fraser Avenue)

- Waasis Road (past Freeman's Convenience Store and the mailbox, prior to the skateboard park)

- End of Saint John Avenue (just prior to MacKenzie Avenue)



FALL CURBSIDE YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Pickup Dates:

- Wards 1–3: November 3–7, 2025
- Ward 4 (Lincoln): November 10–17, 2025

**No pickup on November 11 in observance of Remembrance Day*

Eligible Organic Yard Waste:

- Yard Waste such as leaves, pieces of trees, brush, lawn rakings, soil plants, garden refuse and similar articles
- Leaves and other similar yard waste are to be bagged in compostable bags and placed at curbside for pick-up
- Items are not to exceed 5cm in diameter and 1.5m in length (2" x 5') and should be tied into small bundles with natural twine

**Loose leaves, plastic bags, or items not meeting the criteria will not be collected.*

Not Permitted:

- Non-organic yard waste such as lumber or construction materials, appliances, furniture, tires, etc.
- Petroleum, chemical or solvent/paint type products or any hazardous waste

**The Capital Region Service Commission should be contacted for these items at 506-453-2956.*

Residents can also bring eligible organic yard waste to the Dept. of Engineering & Public Works
181 Black Watch Ave.

A waste container is available for plastic bags

Materials **MUST** be placed at curbside by the Monday pickup date by 7:00 a.m.

The Town will make a single pass for pickup. Items not placed out by the specified dates may not be collected

Storms Drains

WINTER IS COMING!

The Town reminds residents that ahead of the first snowfall of the season (or no later than 1st of December), roadways are to be cleared of any items that may be obstructing travel. This encompasses sports equipment such as basketball and hockey nets.

Homeowners with reflective markers at the end of their driveways are also kindly asked that they are placed 1.3 meters (4 feet) from the street to ensure sufficient distance for our plow equipment to pass by.

Snow Plowing Operations:

The Town of Oromocto uses a strategic, priority-based approach to snow removal for Wards 1-3.

Our crews follow a planned snow-clearing route to keep the community safe and accessible.

Snow Removal Priority Order:

- 1) Roadways – starting with major arteries and hospital routes, then collector streets, followed by residential streets and minor roads.
- 2) Sidewalks
- 3) Trails
- 4) Street widening
